1. *Electrical Lookout - look around your home carefully and find 12 electrical appliances which have switches on them. Draw each appliance and write the name of the appliance beneath the picture.*
2. *Different Shapes and Sizes – cities, towns, villages and hamlets are all types of settlements. Do some research to find out more information on two of these types of settlements in your locality. How do their features and facilities differ?*
3. *Journey Planners – Use a road atlas to plan the route you would take between two locations.*
4. *Big Garden Birdwatch – The RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch is coming up at the end of January. See more details to follow in the Weekly Bulletin on how you can take part. Record your results.*
5. *City Surveyors – Design a brand new city. Consider a name, physical and human features, and essential and desirable facilities. Can you create your own map symbols to show the features of your city?*
6. *Mad Hatter’s Tea Party – produce a ‘wacky afternoon tea’ menu for the Mad Hatter. Remember to include drinks as well as sweet and savoury treats. Be creative!*
7. *Sacred Designs - design a ‘sacred building’. Add labels to your design. You must then write a list of rules for people visiting your building.*
8. *The Big Blackout - Imagine all electricity in the world was suddenly switched off with no idea of when or if it would be turned back on. How might you cook, keep warm and have light in the evenings? Write a story about how you would survive.*
9. *Electrical Safety - Design an electrical safety poster for younger children. What information would you include?*
10. *Create your own board game. With this, you must also include detailed instructions.*
