

Britain at War: Year 5 Summer Term

The Summer term homework will consist of homework focusing upon three key subjects; English, maths and topic. This allows children to practise a variety of skills and share a range of learning with those at home. The homework should be handed in by Wednesday in order to allow time for it to be marked and given back to the children. Choose up to five tasks ...

Anne Frank: Research Anne Frank's life, including her experiences during the war and her diary.

Glenn Miller: Learn about Glenn Miller's popular jazz music and the instruments used in his compositions.

Timeline of Events: Create a timeline of key events in WWII, focusing on the period relevant to Britain.

Fashions: Compare wartime fashions with modern styles.

Games: Research and play 1940s games, documenting the process and taking photos.

Fictional Diary Entry: Write a diary entry from the perspective of a child living during the war.

Anderson Shelter: Design and build a model of an Anderson shelter, considering the materials used and their purpose.

Battlefield: Design and play a game of Battleships using a homemade board.

Artwork: Research and create artwork inspired by WWII, such as a painting or a drawing of a wartime scene.

Song: Write a song to boost morale during wartime.

Recipe: Research a WWII recipe and make it at home, including photography and a review.

Advice Leaflet: Write instructions or an advice leaflet for citizens during an air raid.

Word Search: Create a word search puzzle with WWII terms.
