



Autumn Term Homework

The autumn term homework will consist of homework focusing upon three key subjects; English, maths and topic. This allows children to practise a variety of skills and share a range of learning with those at home. The homework should be handed in by Wednesday in order to allow time for it to be marked and given back to the children.

Maths

The maths homework will be given out on a weekly basis. The children will choose their challenge and it will always be based upon the skills that have been practised throughout the week.

Literacy

- 1) Take the role of your favourite Poet by using their techniques to create poem in a similar way, describing an Ancient Egyptian tomb. This will include writing or printing out your favourite poem and then showing us how you have used similar styles in your own poem. This will include using some of the features they have used, for example similes, metaphors, rhyming.
- 2) Write a diary entry about your first day as a mummification priest! Were you scared? Or maybe you were excited? Include paragraphs when you talk about the different parts of your day. Also remember that you must use punctuation, wow words and your neatest handwriting.
- 3) Create a fact file about an archaeologist. This will mean researching different archaeologists and sharing key facts and details about their adventures.
- 4) Design a front cover for the story 'The Story of Tutankhamun'.

As you are aware, the children are expected to read on a daily basis. For every summary and signature in their reading record, they will receive a stamp.

Topic

- 1) Create a seven day food menu for a week in Ancient Egypt. Research ancient recipes to include but also find out all of the foods they ate and create your own recipes with these. What imaginative meals can you think of?
- 2) Create your own Ancient Egyptian themed top trump cards. Amun may be stronger than Anubis, but Anubis may trump him in appearance (Jackal-head) or kindness.
- 3) Prepare a lesson/PowerPoint about any of the areas of learning that we are covering: properties and materials, The Ancient Egyptians, rivers, etc. You will be able to share your presentation with the class!
- 4) Invent a new set of hieroglyphics and write them out. Then use them to write your name and a fact that you have learnt.
