**This term our topic will be:**

**Welcome to the New Academic Year!**

As always, our homework will be linked closely to the learning we are doing this term, covering **Maths, Literacy and topic-related activities**. Homework should be handed in on **Wednesdays**, and to encourage effort and pride, children will receive a **stamp or sticker** for each piece completed well. For particularly impressive work, they may even be awarded a **Purleigh Stamp!**

To ensure every child is recognised fairly, the completion of homework will be logged carefully so that the correct **Homework Award** can be given at the end of term. The different tasks can be found on our class page, and children may complete them in any order that works best for them.

Above all, please remember that **reading is the most valuable homework**. Building it into a daily routine makes a real difference, and we recommend at least **10 minutes of reading every day**.

1. Decorate your homework book! You can stick on pictures or captions, draw pictures and cut them out, use pictures from magazines and posters or print pictures/photos from your computer.
2. Re-tell your favourite fairy tale, in the style of your choice (you can be extremely creative) . Some ways you could do this may include bringing in: a picture of you dressed as a character; a drawing of a character or story setting; a biscuit decorated to represent the story; a prop; a front cover design, or even turn a potato into a character.
3. Make a Viking long ship. A photo will be taken and stuck into your homework book.
4. Find out how the Vikings made their ships, where they travelled and why the ships were so effective.
5. Vikings had to be big and strong! Create a list of 5 exercises that they could do. Give them a try, too!
6. Choose a times table and write it out using Roman Numerals.
7. Find out about Roman mosaics and make one of your own.
8. Make a labelled poster of a Roman soldier.
9. Look around your home and make draw and label all of the digital devices.
10. Create a series of images to represent stop-motion animation.
11. Draw a shadow picture. Use a torch or the sunlight to cast the shadow and then draw around it. Colour and label it.

Ongoing:

- Reading – ideally every day but try to aim for a minimum of 4 times per week.
- Weekly spellings – these will be given out on a Tuesday (in reading records) and can also be found on the Purleigh website class page.
- Weekly arithmetic – this will be set on the class page each week. The sheets do not need to be printed unless you so wish. The questions set will relate to the learning that has taken place each week in class.
