

Saints and Dragons!
Year Two Homework Spring Term 2026



Happy New Year and welcome to the Spring Term. Thank you for your ongoing support with your child's homework, including times tables and regular reading practice; this continues to have a big impact on progress, both with reading and with the development of vocabulary to support writing.

Once again, this term's homework is linked to our learning at school. As previously, you and your child can decide which homework you wish to complete each week and then you should each make a comment, using the attached sheet. There is no need to work through the tasks in order, although you may choose to do this. Please send in each piece of homework as soon as it is complete. Homework books will continue to be marked each week so long as they are in school by Wednesday in order that they can be returned by Friday, ready for the weekend.

1. Make a fact file: Choose a famous London landmark to research. Draw it carefully, adding labels and then write at least three interesting facts about it.



2. Draw or make the flags for the four countries in the United Kingdom. Find out which is the national flower and the national animal for each country.

3. Create your own dragon character. Give it a name and describe what your dragon is like. Is he or she friendly? Fierce? Brave? Cowardly? Kind? What does he or she like to do? Add an illustration to complete your character description. Make sure that you write on lines and use a writing pencil like we do at school.



4. Make a 3D model of a London landmark and bring it into school to display.

5. Play an online Maths game such as those recommended on our class page. Let me know if you find one that works really well for you – maybe the other children would like to try it too!

6. Look at some pictures of the work of Georgia O'Keeffe. Choose one that you like and print a picture of this to stick into your homework book. Write a paragraph to explain what you can see in the picture and what you like about it. Again, use lines and a writing pencil.

7. Choose a dragon story to read or one that you have read before. Design your own cover for the story which gives clues to what the story is about. For an extra challenge, you could write a 'blurb' that would go on the back cover.

8. On the 29th January, it will be the start of the Chinese New Year. This year will be the Year of the Dragon. Find out in which animal year you were born and draw a picture of the animal. Write about some of the characteristics you are supposed to have.
