Teachers have observed and team taught with specialist coaches and as a result can deliver exceptional PE lessons and run successful sporting clubs. Teachers have attended courses to improve their understanding of sporting practices, learn a range of games and activities and identify specific coaching methods to help children realise their potential. These new skills have been distributed across the teaching team through staff meetings and reference materials.	This can be evidenced in the lesson plans and lesson observations which highlight the activity levels of the children, level of challenge and accessibility. Pupil and staff feedback have reported increased levels of confidence and enjoyment in PE lessons and clubs.
