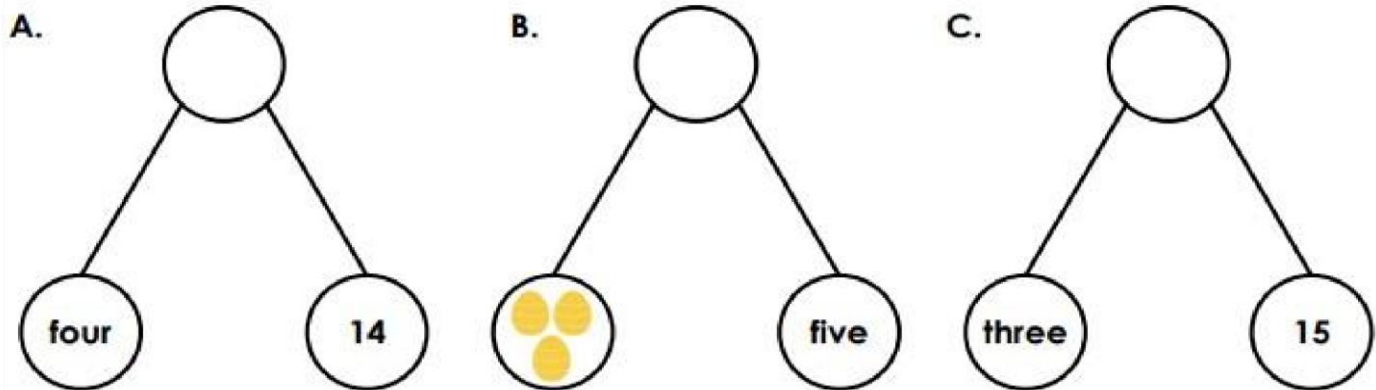


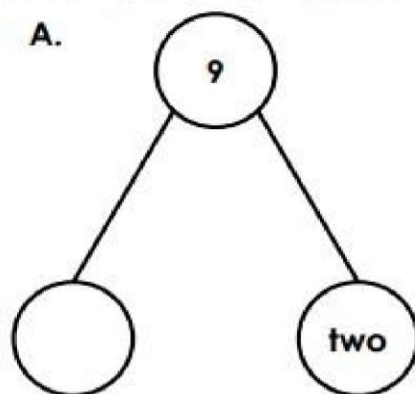
Please use the questions as a guide. The children do not need to have the questions printed out and can complete them directly in their homework books.

The questions each week will act as revision of the skills and methods the children have already worked on at school.

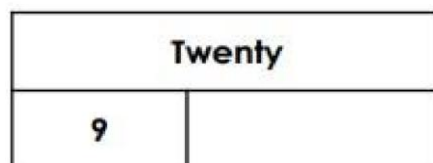
7. Complete and match the related number bonds to find the odd one out.
